4 First Aid Measures

Inhalation:

If inhaled, remove to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. Seek medical attention if breathing problems develop.

Skin Contact:

In case of skin contact, immediately remove contaminated clothing and wash affected areas with water and soap. Seek medical attention if symptoms occur.

Eye Contact:

In case of eye contact, rinse cautiously with water for several minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. Seek medical attention.

Ingestion:

If swallowed, do not induce vomiting. Do not give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Seek immediate medical attention.

Symptoms Caused by Exposure:

6 Accidental Release Measures

Personal Precautions, Protective Equipment and Emergency Procedures:

Wear Safe Work Australia approved dust/particulate filter respirator and full protective clothing. Evacuate all non-essential personnel from affected area. Do not breathe dust. Ensure adequate ventilation. Avoid generating dust.

Environmental Precautions:

In the event of a major spill, prevent spillage from entering drains or water courses.

Methods and Materials for Containment and Cleaning Up:

Stop leak if safe to do so and sweep granules into a pile and shovel into drums for subsequent disposal. Avoid generating dust. Provide adequate ventilation. Decontaminate spill area with detergent and water.

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Prepared spray spill absorb with sand, earth, vermiculite or some other absorbent material. Collect the spilled material and place into a suitable container for disposal.

7 Handling and Storage

Precautions for Safe Handling:

Use of safe work practices are recommended to avoid eye or skin contact and inhalation of dust. Food, beverages and tobacco products should not be stored or consumed where this material is in use. Always wash hands before smoking, eating, drinking or using the toilet. Wash contaminated clothing and other protective equipment before storage or re-use. Provide eyewash fountains and safety showers in close proximity to points of potential exposure.

Conditions for Safe Storage:

Store in a cool, dry and well ventilated area. Keep in original container tightly closed when not in use. Protect from direct sunlight and moisture. Keep away from strong oxidising agents, acids and bases.

Chronic Health Effects:

At high levels mancozeb affects the thyroid, liver, and nervous system in laboratory animals. The thyroid and liver effects are due to its metabolism in small amounts to ethylenethiourea (ETU), which interferes with thyroid hormone synthesis and induces stress-related liver growth.

Existing Conditions Aggravated by Exposure: No information available

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Additional toxicological information:

The Australian Acceptable Daily Intake (ADI) for mancozeb for a human is 0.006 mg/kg/day, set for the public for daily, lifetime exposure. This is based on the NOAEL of 0.6 mg/kg/day, the level determined to show no effects during long term exposure for the most sensitive indicators and the most sensitive species.

12 Ecological Information

Ecotoxicity: Mancozeb is of low toxicity to bees, birds and earthworms.

Aquatic toxicity: Mancozeb is highly toxic to fish and aquatic organisms

Persistence and Degradability:

Mancozeb is of low soil persistence, with a reported field half-life of 1 to 7 days. Mancozeb rapidly and spontaneously degrades to ETU (ethylenethiourea) in the presence of water and oxygen. ETU may persist for longer, on the order of 5 to 10 weeks.

Bioaccumulative Potential: Mancozeb does not bioaccumulate.

Mobility in Soil: Mancozeb has low mobility in soil due to rapid degradation
