3 Composition and Information on Ingredients

7 Handling and Storage

Precautions for Safe Handling:

Apply this product carefully. Spray drift may cause serious damage to other desirable plants. Use of safe work practices are recommended to avoid eye or skin contact and inhalation of dust.
